**Online:** We now offer online registration/payment using rSchools software. This is the same program used to register for PCR, summer school & class fees, making it so that you can have one account for all of your enrichment opportunities. **By Mail:** Send in your registration form and a check to the Community Education Office at: 1220 St. Croix St., Prescott, WI 54021. Make checks payable to: Prescott School District.

**By Phone:** Call the Community Education Office at 715-262-4676. Please note that there are no set office hours during summer vacation - messages will be checked roughly twice a week. Your place is confirmed when payment is received within five business days. Make checks payable to the Prescott School District.

**In Person:** Visit the Community Education Office between the hours of 8am-1pm, Monday-Friday, on school days. We are located at the Prescott Intermediate School, 1220 St. Croix St.

## REGISTRATION INFORMATION

**Confirmation:** There will be no confirmation of registration. You will only be notified if a class is full, canceled, or if there is a change in date, time or place.

**Refunds: Classes:** Refunds will be made if requested at least one week before the class begins, or before the noted registration deadline. If less than one week, the refund will be given as a class credit minus any unrecoverable costs.

The key word that distinguishes spirited children from other children is “more” – more intense, more persistent, more sensitive, and more uncomfortable with change. The spirited child can easily overwhelm parents, leaving them feeling frustrated and ineffective.

## Boater/PWC Safety Sessions Boating Skills & Seamanship Series All Ages are Welcome!

WI State Law: A child under age of 10 cannot operate a motorboat; a child 10-11 years old may operate a motorboat only if accompanied by a parent or adult (18 yrs +) designated by the parent; a child 12-15 years old may operate a motorboat if he/she has completed a boater safety course that is accepted by WI DNR, or is accompanied by a parent or adult (18 yrs +) designated by the parent; a person at least 16 years old may operate a motorboat only if he/she has completed a boater safety course that is accepted by WI DNR – adults born before Jan. 1, 1989 are exempt from the safety course requirement.

About Boating Safety (ABS) is a unique study program covering the fundamentals of boating. The course is designed for skippers and crew of all types of watercraft. If you are born after 1989 and need your Watercraft Operators Permit, this course meets the MN and WI requirements. The course material is covered in seven chapters, which touch on:

- Know your Boat
- Safely Operating Your Boat or PWC
- Before You Get Underway
- Navigating the Waterways
- The Legal Requirements of Boating
- Boat Emergencies...What to Do?
- Enjoying Water Sports With Your Boat

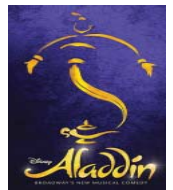

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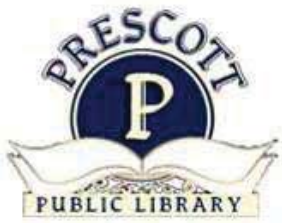
