# **Campus Visit Checklist**

Visits to schools beat pictures in brochures any day! If you have the opportunity, you should experience college life first-hand...to be sure your home away from home will be the right one for you. Carefully plan each visit.

## Planning the Visit:

- \* Get a map of the campus.
- \* Plan at least a full day at each school.
- \* Visit when school is in session
- \* Arrange an interview with an admissions officer or sign up for a group session, if available.
- \* Prepare a list of questions you might have about the school.
- \* Get a notebook to record the answers and your impressions

#### What to Do:

- \* Take a campus tour.
- \* Talk with students and faculty.
- \* Attend a college event, if possible
- \* Check out the student newspaper & bulletin boards.

\* Check out the stuff that's important to you--dorms, libraries, computer labs, student unions, athletic facilities, etc.

### What to Look For:

- \* Watch how students spend their time--studying, partying, socializing, exercising, etc.
- \* Check out the size of the average dorm room and what furniture is available.
- \* Look at what students have in their rooms and how they've arranged it--computers, TVs, etc.
- \* What's available off campus--restaurants, theaters, museums, public libraries, job opportunities?
  - \* How well the campus & its facilities are maintained.

#### What to Ask:

- \* Are there active fraternities and sororities on campus?
- \* How good is the food in the dining facilities?

\* How many students are enrolled in the college? Your specific program? What is the average class size? How big is the largest class?

\* What intercollegiate and intramural teams are represented on campus?

\* Do you have student organizations and activities?

\* How safe is the campus? Where is campus security located? Are there safety programs, such as escorts and emergency phone boxes on campus?
