# 2019-2020 SCHOOL YEAR LUNCH PRICES

Every year, school districts calculate lunch prices to align with inflation and maintain USDA suggested pricing. For the second year in a row, there will be no increase to cost of student breakfast or milk prices. Prices will be increased by \$0.15 for K-5th grade and adult lunches and by \$0.10 for 6-12 grade lunches:

K-5 (and St. Joseph's): \$2.90 6-12 Grades: \$3.10 Adult Lunches: \$3.90



### 2019 WELCOME BACK MESSAGE FROM SUPERINTENDENT, DR. RICK SPICUZZA

Backpacks are filled with supplies, students are brimming with anticipation, families are welcoming a familiar routine – all signs that a new school year is fast approaching. As students return with stories about summer break, school staff return with a commitment to excellence to make this the "best year ever".

Prescott School District employees continually strive to make a positive difference in our community and for our students. Employees in every position are proud to serve as public educators developing future successful leaders. September 3rd we open our doors to students, staff, families and our greater community through a variety of services and activities including:



- <u>Transportation</u> Each and every day we operate a fleet of 20 buses, 5 vans, and 2 cars to safely deliver students to school, extracurricular activities and back home, including service to our 4K Centers, and parochial students. Drivers are the first smile of the day and the last encouraging word as students are safely delivered to their destinations.
- <u>Food Service</u> Staff prepare and deliver over 100 breakfast and 725 student lunches on a daily basis, including to
  our parochial students. Encouraging healthy options and assuring food safety provides nutrition every child needs for
  successful learning.
- Custodial and Maintenance Grounds and Facilities employees maintain \$88 Million Dollars of Public Facility Assets
  with 60 plus acres of greenspace for youth sports and public parks throughout the city of Prescott owned and cared
  for by the Prescott Public Schools. Assuring well-groomed fields and properly maintained equipment provides safe
  space for healthy activity for students and all members of our community.
- <u>Health and Wellness</u> School nurses provide daily medication and monitoring of students with medical necessities, along with coordinating staff training and supplies for basic first aid response. With the success of mental health grant funding, Prescott schools will also continue addressing the social-emotional and mental health needs of our students and families. Being healthy and feeling supported are vital to good learning.
- <u>Data Processing and Technology</u> Technology staff manage over 1,000 devices to provide safe and relevant
  computing technology as well as enriched programming for students, faculty, and staff. Using the right tools in a safe
  manner supports the skills students need in preparing for their next educational and life learning.
- Special Education Programming Pupil services staff serve nearly 200 students ages 3 to 21 with special education
  programming to enhance educational success and provide access to all learners. Using individual or specialized skills
  unlocks opportunities for these students.
- General Education Programming Prescott teachers and assistants provide early 4K through Advance College
  Level educational programming year-round to Prescott youth. There are abundant opportunities throughout the year,
  including summer school, community education, PCR, and extra-curricular programming. A wide range of options
  allows students to apply their learning and explore their interests in meaningful and fulfilling ways.

Prescott School District employees are proud of this community's traditions and legacy. We are committed to a continuous improvement model in all facets of the organization and are proud of the partnerships we have within this strong, supportive community. Great things are occurring each day and we invite your family to take time to experience the array of educational and extracurricular events that PSD presents every month.
