HOW TO REGISTER...

Online: We offer online registration/payment using rSchools software. This is the same program used to register for PCR, making it so that you can have one account for all of your enrichment opportunities. See the school district website (www.prescott.k12.wi.us) or click on "Community" and then "Community Education".

By Mail: Send in your registration form and a check to the Community Education Office at: 1220 St. Croix St., Prescott, WI 54021. Make checks payable to: Prescott Community Ed.

By Phone: Call the Community Education Office at 715-262-4676. Your place is confirmed once payment has been received. Make checks payable to the Prescott Community Ed.

In Person: Visit the Community Education Office between the hours of 8am-2pm, Monday-Friday, on school days. We are located at the Prescott Middle School, 1220 St. Croix Street.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Confirmation: There will be no confirmation of registration. You will only be notified if a class is full, canceled, or if there is a change in date, time or place.

Boat Safety Class

Age Requirement: WI and MN do not issue boat operating permits for anyone under the age of 12. That said, if a child age 10 or 11 takes the class with their parent, the child's information will still be entered into the system as having completed the class and once they turn 12, the parent can notify the DNR and an operator permit can be issued.

Body Rolling and Foot Massage Self-Care and Wellness

Body rolling is a great way to improve flexibility, relieve tension, and enhance muscle recovery. You can do this exercise with a foam roller, which is a lightweight, cylindrical tube of compressed foam. It’s a popular technique for self-myofascial release, which can help soothe tight, sore areas (known as “trigger points”) and speed up muscle recovery. Foot massage has benefits in promoting overall relaxation and well-being. Relieves stress, improves circulation, pain relief and reduces effects of edema.

In this class and workshop, you will learn how to provide yourself body rolling and foot massages to improve your self-care routine and overall wellness. We will introduce Ayurveda oils and essential oils. And, you can take what you learn and pass on to others to give a great foot massage!

No prior skills necessary. You will need a mat, towel and a lightweight, cylindrical foam roller. Min 4/Max 15

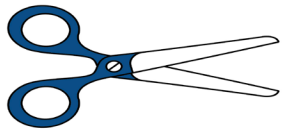
