#### HOW TO REGISTER...

**Online:** We offer online registration/payment using rSchools software. This is the same program used to register for PCR, so that you can have one account for all of your enrichment opportunities. See the school district website (www. prescott.k12.wi.us) click on "Community" and then "Community Education."

By Mail: Send in your registration form and a check to the Community Education Office at: 1220 St. Croix St., Prescott, WI 54021. Make checks payable to: Prescott Community Ed.

By Phone: Call the Community Education Office at 715-262-4676. Your place is confirmed when payment is received. Make checks payable to the Prescott Community Ed.

In Person: Visit the Community Education Office between the hours of 8am-2pm, Monday-Friday, on school days. We are located at the Prescott Middle School, 1220 St. Croix Street.

#### REGISTRATION INFORMATION

#### **Confirmation:**

The only confirmation of your registration is via an email from the registration program rSchools.

#### Notification of Changes/Cancelation:

You will be notified via email or phone if a class is canceled, or if there is a change in date, time or place. In the case of a cancelation by the instructor or Community Ed, you will receive a full refund.

*Trips:* If weather does not permit the school to provide transportation, but the show itself is not canceled, your refund will not include the ticket price. In this instance, you are still welcome to drive yourself to the performance. If the theater/establishment cancels the production, a full refund or credit to a future show will be given.

#### **Refunds:**

- *Classes:* If you need to cancel your registration seven days or more before the class start date, a processing fee will be deducted from your refund. Courses under \$124 will be charged a \$5 processing fee. Courses \$125 and higher will be charged a \$10 processing fee. If less than one week, that refund will be minus any unrecoverable costs (such as supplies the instructor has already purchased).
- *Trips:* If you need to cancel your registration before the trip registration deadline, a processing fee will be deducted before the refund is processed (see above). No refunds will be given after the noted registration deadlines unless you find someone else to take your place.

Class Size: The minimum and maximum number of students required will vary per class. Help get the word out to ensure your class will be held!



# **Instant Challenge Workshop** *For Grades 1-8*

Instant Challenges encourage students to work together to develop collaborative problem-solving strategies, as well as performance and improvisational techniques. They also help students learn how to think creatively and to evaluate and use different types of materials in innovative ways. There are three types of DI Instant Challenges: Performance-Based, Task-Based, and a combination of the two.

- The focus of a Performance-Based Instant Challenge is on working together to create and perform a theatrically-oriented solution. Your team may be asked to use words, language, conversation, and/or dramatic characterizations to solve the Challenge, or the solution may be nonverbal. You may also be asked to manipulate materials and/or use imaginary props in the solution.
- The focus of a Task-Based Instant Challenge is on working together to move, build, change, and/or protect something in order to complete a task. You may also be asked to communicate information.
- A Combination Instant Challenge includes both performance- and task-based elements.

One of the most important things is that there is no right or wrong way to solve an Instant Challenge. They are intentionally designed to have multiple solutions, which means you can do the same Instant Challenge over and over again to come up with new ways to solve it. This is a great class for any kids who like to think outside of the box and for those interested in participating in Destination Imagination next year. Min 4
