An update was provided on the cost to remove the portables. The amount budgeted was \$100K. There would be a remaining balance of approximately \$18K that could be used to pay for the installation of the playground equipment at Malone Intermediate.

Steve Sizemore formally announced he will seek another term on the School Board and submit his Declaration for Candidacy papers for the April 2017 election.
